

WHAT'S EXPECTED OF ME?

When attending a Corrective Services New South Wales program, it's important that you're always respectful of the other participants and the facilitators.

When the people in a group feel valued and respected they are able contribute more and listen to others.

Being respectful in a group program means you treat other people how you would like to be treated. You listen to others when they are talking and you follow the group rules.

You need to turn up on time and attend every session.

You must be sober and not affected by drugs. If you are alcohol or drug affected, you will be asked to leave the program and your Community Corrections Officer will be notified.

Make sure your phone is off or on silent. You can check your phone before and after the session and in breaks.

The trained, group facilitators will help and guide you through the program.

Do your best to participate in discussions and activities. Your ideas and experiences may help other participants in the program.
